<b>Step 1: Read God's Word</b>  Look at the passage  <b>Genesis 6:9-14</b>	<b>Step 2: What Does God's Word Say?</b> List the facts <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Re-read God's Word</li> <li>• List the outstanding facts with verse numbers</li> <li>• Do not paraphrase</li> </ul>	<b>Step 3: What Does God's Word Mean?</b> Learn the lessons <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write one spiritual lesson for each fact in Step 2</li> <li>• Is there an example to follow, a command to obey, a warning to heed, a promise to claim?</li> </ul>	<b>Step 4: What Does God's Word Mean In My Life?</b> Listen to His voice <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put the lessons from Step 3 in the form of a question to ask yourself or someone else</li> </ul>
